### KEY CONCERNS FOR DEFENSE LAWYERS

Validity and reliability (or lack thereof)

Disclosure and vindication of Constitutional rights

Expert concerns

Limitations of an adversarial system

#### VALIDITY AND RELIABILITY

- Serious issues in traditional forensics with validity and reliability have persisted over decades
- Al tools are likely to encounter or exacerbate many of the same problems
- Additionally, Al tools (currently) often used in contexts that prevent or limit reliability challenges in the first instance

#### DISCLOSURES AND CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS

- Many key Constitutional rights, including Due Process and Confrontation Clause rights, are implicated by Al
- What is disclosed and how are major concerns for the defense bar (see, e.g., PGS litigation)
- Important questions about whether any disclosure is sufficient in the context of these systems

#### **EXPERT CONCERNS**

- Finding and retaining appropriate experts already very difficult for defense bar
- Will the defense be able to find appropriate experts in Al?
- There are also important concerns about the state's experts
  - Will these people understand the systems they are testifying about and be able to be cross-examined?

#### LIMITS TO AN ADVERSARIAL SYSTEM

- Al in forensics poses society wide issues
- Defense function often raises some of these concerns
- But ethical obligations (as well as limitations to the legal system)
  mean defense cannot be primary or only way that broader
  questions about use of these systems is considered
